THE CHURCH OFFERS NURTURING, EXPERIENCED, CHILDCARE: For the 8:00 a.m. services, the nursery for infants and children up to 4 years old is available in Huffman Hall, the nursery is located down the hallway on the parking lot side of Huffman Hall. At 9 a.m. the 2 to 4 year olds go to Room 5 of the Education Building Nursery. Both Nurseries close at 12:15 p.m. There is also a comfortable, soundproof room in the Sanctuary balcony for adults who wish to keep their babies with them during the services. 3 and 4 year old children have two options on Sunday mornings. ALL children, through age 4, are welcome in the nursery on Sunday morning. Those children who are reliably potty trained and developmentally ready for a more structured environment are invited to attend Sunday School from 9:15 - 10:15 in the Basement of the Sanctuary and Children's Chapel in Basement Room, B-18 from 10:30 - 11:05.

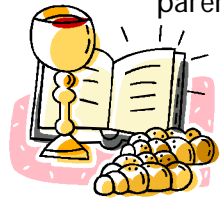
Parish Get Acquainted Luncheon

DATE: Sunday, November 1, after 10:30 service in Huffman Hall.
PURPOSE: To introduce new members to YOU.

Sunday, November 1st: SUN ONE is a unique youth group comprised of students (grades 6 through 12) from all the Episcopal youth groups in the Austin area. Each first Sunday of the month the group strives to strengthen the relationship between Austin youth and Christ as we gather for worship, dinner, and fellowship. This will be the first gathering of the year, held at Zilker Park. We will gather at 2:00 pm on the south side of Zilker Park (look for the SUN ONE Banner in the parking lot near the fields off of Robert E. Lee Drive.) The event concludes at 5:00 pm. The St. Matthew's group will meet and depart from Zilker Park.

SAC "First Friday": On Friday, November 6, 2009, Donna Fullilove, a representative of Austin Police Department's "Victim Assistance Program", will discuss the services provided by the division. The program will be at 11:00 A.M. in Huffman Hall, followed by a covered dish luncheon at 12:00 noon. Bring a dish to share-casserole, meat, vegetable, salad, dessert or whatever, and partake of food and fellowship.

ALL baptized children are welcome at the communion rail at St. Matthew's, no matter what their age. It is the parent who decides when a child is ready to begin to receive communion. Children's Sunday School

David, the Shepherd Boy who became King



Join us in Children's Sunday School November 1st, 8th, 15th, and 22nd as we learn about David, the Shepherd Boy who became King and experience the scripture readings through art, theater, cooking and science, and music.

We will spend the month discovering how God saw something in David that no one else could see. David was a simple shepherd boy who went on to beat Goliath and become the second king of Israel. We will learn how God uses ordinary men and women to accomplish his work in the world. We will discover that everyone has God-given gifts, and that God cares more about what is on the inside than how we look on the outside.

The 3 and 4 year olds will hear the story of Moses parting the Red Sea on November 1st, the story of the 10 commandments on November 8th, the story of David, the boy on November 15th, and will join the older kids on November 22nd for music and movement.

Chapel in B-18 – A child and family friendly Chapel service is held EVERY Sunday morning in B-18 (Basement of the Sanctuary). Don't miss the fun! The service begins at 10:30 and is geared to the needs of children ages 3 through 3rd grade, but "lap sitters" are always welcome with a parent and older children are welcome to join us as helpers. Through carefully chosen words, music and activities, our daily lessons, Episcopal heritage, and the rhythm of our liturgy will come to life in the hands and hearts of our children. The Chapel service is led by a team of wonderful volunteers. Parents are invited to bring their children directly to B-18 before the 10:30 worship begins or to sign them directly through to Chapel when you drop them off at Sunday School. All the children will be returned to the sanctuary at the Peace so that families can celebrate communion together.

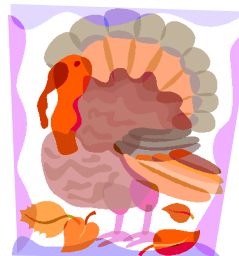
Thanksgiving Basket Event - Donations due by Tuesday, November 17 in the Commons
