GOOD NEWS FOR CONTRIBUTORS TO HAITI RELIEF! President Obama has signed into law the opportunity to deduct cash donations made between January 11, 2010 and March 1, 2010 for Haiti relief on your 2009 tax return - you do not have to wait until you file your tax return for 2010. The IRS treats credit and debit card payments, checks and money orders the same as cash. The IRS also requires a "paper trail" of receipts for deductible donations to charities. For the first time ever, the IRS will accept your telephone bill as a receipt if you donate by using your cell phone to text your donation to a Haiti relief organization. Sunday February 7: SUN ONE is a unique youth group comprised of students (grades 6 through 12) from four different youth groups in the Austin area. Every first Sunday of the month the group strives to strengthen the relationship between Austin youth and Christ as we gather for worship, dinner, and fellowship. This event will be from 1:30 pm to 3:30 pm at All Saint's Episcopal Church, 209 West 27th St. Austin, Texas 78705. The St. Matthew's group will meet and depart from All Saint's. Because of Super Bowl Sunday we will be meeting earlier to participate in a fun game and lunch.

Children's Sunday School – Join us in Children's Sunday School February 7th, 14th, and 21st as we learn about

Jesus calling his 12 disciples. Jesus traveled everywhere telling people about the love of God. But he couldn't do it alone; he needed some helpers. Those helpers turned out to be the 12 disciples. Jesus asks us to be disciples too – sharing the love of God with others. The children will experience the calling of the 12 disciples through art, theater, and science and cooking. We will be making beaded fish key chains in art, watching a movie of Jesus calling the disciples in theater, and making fish pizzas in science and cooking.

On February 7th, the K/1st graders will do art, the 2nd/3rd graders will do science/cooking, and the 4th/5th graders will do theater. The 3 and 4 year olds will hear the story of Jesus calling his 12 disciples on February 7th. On February 14th and 21st, they will hear about miracles - Jesus calming the sea and feeding the 5,000.

Kindergartners through 5th graders gather at the end of Sunday School in Room B-21 for snack. All ages are then escorted to Children's Chapel or picked up by their parents.

Chapel in B-18 – A child and family friendly Chapel service is held EVERY Sunday morning in B-18 (Basement of the Sanctuary). Don't miss the fun! The service begins at 10:30 and is geared to the needs of children ages 3 through 3rd grade, but "lap sitters" are always welcome with a parent and older children are welcome to join us as helpers. Through carefully chosen words, music and activities, our daily lessons, Episcopal heritage, and the rhythm of our liturgy will come to life in the hands and hearts of our children. The Chapel service is led by a team of wonderful volunteers. Parents are invited to bring their children directly to B-18 before the 10:30 worship begins or to sign them directly through to Chapel when you drop them off at Sunday School. All the children will be returned to the sanctuary at the Peace so that families can celebrate communion together.

The story for this Sunday is Luke 4:21-30. We will hear the continuation of the story about how Jesus teaches to and faces the rejection of the people of his hometown.

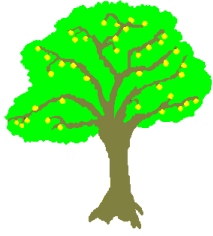
